National Protection Framework: Whole Community Preparedness

The Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) [National Protection Framework](#) was designed to help educate communities about the routine security-related measures that can be taken in protecting against terrorist attacks, natural disasters, and other hazards.

The document, which was released in July, is one of five documents within the National Planning Frameworks. Each document covers a specific preparedness area – prevention, protection, mitigation, response, recovery. The National Protection Framework is specifically tied to steady-state or enhanced steady-state activities for all kinds of hazards, as well as security and threat deterrence.

The Protection Framework further describes the roles and responsibilities, core capabilities, and coordinating structures that enable the protection of individuals, communities, and the nation. Download the PDF at <http://www.fema.gov/media-library/assets/documents/97350>.

Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills: More than Stop, Drop and Cover

On October 16, 2014 at 10:16 a.m., Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills will be held at homes, businesses, schools, churches



and government institutions around the globe. In 2013, over 24.9 million people registered as participants worldwide, and over 17 million people have registered for the 2014 drill as of September 2.

The drills are an opportunity to learn how to prepare yourself and your community for what to do during or in the aftermath of an earthquake. Participants will practice “Drop, Cover and Hold On,” and be given guidance to update emergency supplies and plans, and secure spaces to prevent injury or damage.
