SUMMIT ENGAGES REGIONAL PARTNERS IN CYBERSECURITY

On May 21, the Snohomish County Public Utility District and PNNL cohosted the Washington State Cybersecurity Summit. Now in its fourth year, the summit brings together regional partners and industry leaders in engaging discussion around issues concerning cybersecurity and the nation's critical infrastructure.



The event welcomed more than 150 industry leaders and policymakers to focus on the threats and lessons learned nationally and within Washington. Guest speakers included Courtney Gregoire, President of the Port of Seattle Commission; U.S. Senator Maria Cantwell (via video); Washington State Senator Guy Palumbo; and Bret Arsenault, Chief Information Security Officer of the Microsoft Corporation.

Participants explored how critical infrastructure providers can better share ideas and best practices. Key focus areas included information sharing, workforce development, and regional cybersecurity resources and capabilities.

The event was held in partnership with the Washington National Guard, Port of Seattle, Puget Sound Energy, Seattle City Light, Tacoma Public Utilities, T-Mobile, Trovares Inc., the Washington State Military Department, Washington State Office of the Chief Information Officer, and the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.

SAVER: A RESPONDER RESOURCE FOR TECHNOLOGY INFO

Do you purchase equipment for your department or agency? SAVER—the [System Assessment and Validation for Emergency Responders program](#)—assists emergency responders making procurement decisions. Established by the U.S Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) and managed by S&T's [National Urban Security Technology Laboratory](#), SAVER conducts operationally oriented assessments and validations on commercial oriented equipment and systems and provides those results along with other relevant information to the emergency response community.

Since 2004, more than 1,000 emergency responders and PNNL staff have participated in SAVER focus groups and assessment activities, yielding SAVER reports that are relevant and meet the operational needs of the responder community.

SAVER reports are available to the responder community at no cost. Reports available to download include:

- Anti-Ram Vehicle Barriers
- Blast Resistant Trash Receptacles
- Chemical Agent Detection Equipment
- Computer Forensic Software
- Handheld Underwater Metal Detectors
- Portable Wireless Surveillance Systems.

EDDY COMPLETES LEADERSHIP WASHINGTON PROGRAM

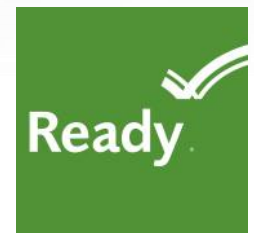
NWRTC Deputy Director Ryan Eddy was one of 13 recent graduates from the Association of Washington Business Leadership Washington program in May.
